

# OSPREY FLY BOX

## Chum Candy

I call this one Chum Candy, have been using this in the fall for Chum and Coho for the past 15 years, it has always done well for me in the Harrison/Fraser systems. Fished on the swing and/or stripped, ideally with either a floating line, intermediate sink or a floating line with a intermediate tip.

Easy to tie and pretty durable, feel free to experiment with different flash materials, the circle hook tends to have less foul hookups as well, can be tied with dumbbell eyes as well.



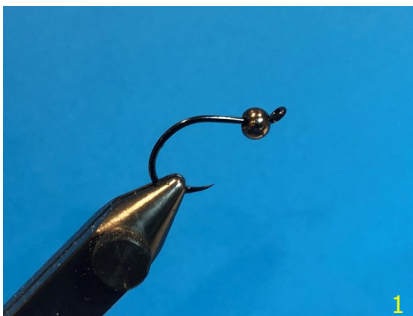
### MATERIALS



#### List of Materials:

- Hook - Daiichi Beakhook-B size 3
- Bead - Black 3/16"
- Thread - Monofilament Ultra fine
- Body / Wing - Polar Flash 2007

### TYING INSTRUCTIONS



1. Pinch the barb and slide the bead on to the hook and place in the vise.

2. Slide the bead down the bend and attach the tinsel mono thread at the start of the bend.

3. Clip off about 12 or so strands of Polarflash and bind in at the bend of the hook.



4. Bind the Polarflash down to the hook shank up to the eye of the hook. Whip finish or use a couple of half hitches then remove the thread. Option to coat the shank with UV cure or Hard as Nails to protect the material.



5. Slide the bead up to the eye.



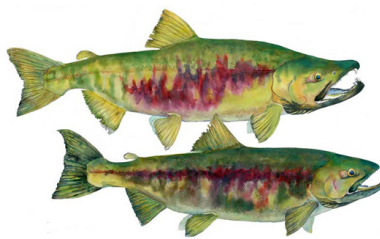
6. Reattach the Mono tying thread right behind the bead.



7. Pull the Polarflash over the bead and bind down.



8. Place a whip finish and a second whip finish as mono can slip undone. Place UV cure or hard as Nails head cement on the Mono for insurance.
